

Youth Expansion Program







We are doing a fantastic job brining in new members into our Jurisdiction so far this year. We are as of the last report I have received, ranked number 9 in the Order with 385 members that gives us an intake of 27.21% of our total intake of 1415. This is our biggest growth for the first 3 months in 3 years. Great job to those Councils that recruited at least one new member! Keep those new members coming in and help us make our Order "Stronger Together" as we fight to win the Final Round of Division Finals of W.S.O.M. against Florida.

With that being said, let's do a reality check on why we need you to continue to work hard. We have a negative 20 for the year of net members with 33108 members. That means we lost more members than we took in so far this year. That comes from suspensions, transfer out of state, or death and not

bringing in enough new members to replace those members. Think about this staggering number, we have 167 Councils that has not recruited one new member. Are we recruiting "One New Member, Per Council, and Per Month"? Are we trying to improve our Councils and our Order with new members? Think about all of the good that we can do with all these new members. Think about doubling our numbers, with just getting that one new member per Council.

We are bringing in those new members and filling those Form 100's and taking them to a 1st Degree. Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries please review those forms before you bring the Candidate to their 1st Degree. Why you say? I am glad you asked! Missing signatures, missing contact information, missing Council numbers, missing dates, and so on with these mistakes that are made on the Form 100. If you are reviewing the form with the admission committee and completely and properly filling it out, we won't have a problem at Supreme. If not, they won't put it in the system at Supreme causing delays. We need those forms to be done correctly for the sake of the new members and more for their families. If something happens to the member and the form is not at Supreme, the family won't get the benefits that's due to them. Those benefits are free to our members and should be promoted when recruiting. Please make it a point to promote and commit to these services we offer to these new

Brother Knights.

Retention is our biggest obstacle to overcome in our Councils. It is a constant battle to keep our members in our Councils through dues and keeping them active. If your Council is not active, you won't keep members from leaving. You are creating an early retirement for your Council to close up somewhere in the near future. An active Council uses programs, whether it is their own, or state programs to keep their members active and involved. Look at the spread sheet on Council membership and look at the accolades they receive at our State Convention; see why they go together. So, we won't lose any more active member if we keep them busy? Not always!

What about the guy that started out being active, then suddenly stopped showing up. What about the guy that made a meeting and no one introduced him to the Council or other Brother Knights? Did the proposer just sign the Form 100 to get the points, or does he help the new member? We are working on a "Mentor Program" that will give Councils the tools they need to help keep all members. You will have active members working with new members and "mentor" them about the Knights and their Council. This is a two for one special for your Council. How? It gives both new and old members a way of building a fraternal relationship and keep the Council active. This is a way to become a Star Council by recruiting, be an active in your Council, and fill out the paper work, and reap the rewards.

In closing, I hope each Council has their Church Drive materials, date and time, and 1st Degree lined up for this month. I know that each of you can and will be successful in finding those new members and their families and helping us build a better Church, Community, and Council in your town. Continue to do the work of the Venerable Fr. Michael J. McGivney and help the widows and orphans in our world today and promote the good work of the Lord our God.
