We will need to make every event an opportunity to recruit new Members It is now time to into our Order. evaluate our Council Membership Recruitment Plans and make adjustments if the plan is not reaching the expected results to accomplish our goals and quotas. Please make sure the Council Membership Recruitment Plan is discussed at every Council Meeting. If there is no Membership Report presented at the meeting, ask for the status of the Membership Plan at the meeting. Membership should be an active topic at every Council Meeting. October is the month for Church Drives. Plan and conduct your activities for a successful Church Drive in your Parish.

Districts are requested to have a minimum of one Admissions Degree per month. Do not delay any candidate from achieving his Admissions Degree due to lack of available Admission Degree in the District. Seek the schedule of Admission Degrees in other Districts or use the Video Admissions Degree to bring in a Brother Knight.

An atheist was driving through the countryside when he came upon a Baptist minister and a Catholic priest standing on the shoulder of the road fishing. Next to them was a big sign that read, "Turn back; the end is near." The atheist took offense at the sign, so he rolled down the window and shouted, "Don't preach to me you religious nuts!" I don't know about you, but I get a little anxious when Jesus starts talking about wars, fake messiahs, insurrections and the destruction of the temple, or how our relatives are going to betray us to authorities. What's even more confusing is when St. Paul seems to be mandating that soup kitchens and pantries be closed down. There has to be a context here about these "end times" somewhere between fundamentalism and dismissal of the scripture!

St. Paul might hold the key. Paul established the Church at Thessaloniki as his first only about 20 years after the death of Jesus. Folks there were particularly concerned about Christ's second coming. In his first letter to them, Paul explains that their friends and relatives who have died will still be part of the resurrection when the Lord comes again. There is no need for them to worry, but

instead, they should do their work and set a good example.

But it seems as if some of these Thessalonians decided that since Jesus would come back any day, and since they were already all saved, they would sit back and have a beer, watch a little football, and let others take care of things. And since Paul already told them by letter that Jesus would come back like a thief in the night, some were compulsively examining every clue to see if Jesus really was coming back soon. Could this or that be a sign?

So he writes them a second letter telling them that the second coming will not come subtly, and they won't miss it. At the same time, he calls down the slackers. We are all to work to build up the community while waiting for Jesus' return. He's basically saying, do your work; don't be a busybody; don't sit around like a slug. Do your part in building up the community and don't say you can't because you're too "busy" waiting for Jesus to save you personally.

What we see in the Scriptures, I think, is a microcosm of the Church today. We have the whole gamut. There are those who take the words of Scripture literally and they look for the end of the world around every corner. There are those who are so worried about their personal salvation, they fail to realize their place in the salvation of others in the community. And there are slugs who simply lounge around awaiting the Parousia. There has to be a healthy balance between them all.

We live in a world where people are hungry, suffering from hunger of every single kind. Let's not sit back and wait for Jesus to come and make things better. Let's work together to make things better in his name. Isn't that what we're supposed to do as Knights?







I would like to begin this new Columbian Year by expressing a heartfelt thank you to each and every Knight of Columbus Councils and Knight of Columbus supporters for their generous donation thus far to the Youth Expansion Program Fundraiser (YEP).

It is imperative however, that you do the mandatory program under Faith, which is the Spiritual Reflection Program. Your council can accomplish this by sending a minimum of 10 brother Knights to the KC State Retreat at Maryhill in Pineville on January 10, 11 and 12, 2020. 



Maryhill Renewal Center, founded in 1948 by the Most Reverend Charles P. Greco, D.D., Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Alexandria, Louisiana, is now under the leadership of the Most Reverend David Talley, D.D.

Easily accessible from major highways, Maryhill is located just northeast of Alexandria, Louisiana. The Center's personalized hospitality and gentle ambiance year-round are accentuated by 186 acres of pine forest with walking paths and stocked lake.

Southside accommodations provide 44 rooms, each with a double bed and private bath, along with two partly handicapped-accessible rooms, each with a single bed and private bath. Also on the Southside are two chapels, a dining hall, and comfortable meeting space for groups numbering from 4 to 80.

Northside overnight accommodations include 5 dormitory-style sleeping cabins with a total of 80 beds, and the Cedar Building, which consists of 12 rooms, each with 2 single beds and a private shower.

Also on the Northside of the lake is the Youth Ministry Center which consists of a meeting room that will seat up to 200 persons, a full commercial kitchen, dining rooms and a pavilion with picnic tables and a barbeque pit. The Northside has its own chapel and, depending on the season, a group can use the in-ground swimming pool and bathhouse.

Directed-Provides time for prayer, solitude and guidance from a personal Spiritual Director. This retreat calls for a willingness to discuss one's prayer experience with the Director. Except for the daily meeting with the Director, the time is spent in silence.
