A Message from Fr. Francis Offia

ENTRANCE PROCESSION:
A JOURNEY TO AN ENCOUNTER.

Somehow our life experiences involve making of all sorts of journeys. Journeying from something, through something, towards something. **To live is to make a journey.** We make a journey to get to our offices, or to our schools. We make a journey to the stadium to watch the game. We make a journey to attend a wedding, funeral or birthday party. Wherever the destination might be, if we don't make that first move, if we didn't continue like the rest of the invited guests, following the same route that leads to the destination, then it is either we arrive late or do not get there at all.

Since the dawn of human salvation, God's relationship with mankind has always involved making a journey. He comes close to us to meet us and He always invites us to come from somewhere to somewhere in order to encounter Him. There is always some kind of **CROSSING OF THE THRESHOLD!** We see this with the call of Abraham and the call of Moses. We see it with the journey of the Israelites from Egypt to the Promised Land. Especially in the New Testament, Jesus' mission is marked by journey from place to place. And as he goes he calls others, especially his disciples, to follow. He brought them to the mountain, he takes them across the sea, he takes them to Jerusalem and ultimately they followed him to the **Mountain Calvary** where he made the supreme sacrifice of Himself.

Unless the disciples actively participated in these journeys, they would have been left behind. They were able to be with their Master, to dine and wine with Him, to witness His ministry, and to experience His Passion, Crucifixion and Death on the Cross because they did participate actively in His journey. **They were not the passive bystanders.** Though they weren't sure where the road might lead them to but they persevered and journeyed along.

Our Liturgy is no exception. In it we come to encounter the Lord; to make a journey with Him. Therefore we have to be participants and not mere observers. And our participation in the actual Liturgy begins with the entrance procession. Think of the moment when Jesus says to His disciples, "*The Hour Has Come let us go Jerusalem*". Remember when He took with Himself Peter, Jesus and John to the

Garden of Gethsemane for an intense time of prayer. Think of the Journey to the Calvary where He offered Himself to the Father. These are the journeys we make with Him when we come to Mass. Don't forget that the Sacrifice on the Cross 2000yrs ago and the Sacrifice of Altar are **ONE AND THE SAME SACRIFICE**. In both of them Christ is the Victim and Priest.

When we gather for Mass, our priest who is acting in the *Persona Christi* (Person of Christ) invites us to make a journey with him to the Altar of Sacrifice where the sacrifice of Christ will be made present. There he offered the sacrifice of the Mass for himself and for all of us. He invites us to make this journey with him by way of **Entrance Procession** and we are expected to respond and participate actively. In the priest and other ministers, the whole church, in a way, are united in that One Procession; that journey into **a sacred time, a sacred moment**, away from all the mundane of everyday life. Our participation at this stage of the Mass involves **STANDING** unless we have some medical conditions. It involves prayerfully joining the choir in **SINGING** the entrance hymn and reflecting on the words of the hymn, or in the case of the weekday Mass, joining the priest and the rest of the congregation in **RECITING** the entrance antiphon. If we begin well, we will surely end well. And I think reverse is the case. Active participation, from the onset of the Mass during the entrance procession prepares and opens us up for that desired encounter with Lord. It dispossess us well for the sacrifice that is to be offered. It helps us to savor the sweetness of that sacred moment when heaven and earth come together in the liturgy of the Mass.

Just pick up the hymnal at the back of the Pew. You can do it.
