By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to certain devotion.

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart represents Christ's love for all mankind. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most widespread and treasured Catholic devotions. It has been incorporated into the liturgy and has been generously praised and recommended by both popes and saints.

The Sacred Heart devotion makes us aware of and reminds us of Christ's immense love for us. It also encourages us to love Him in return. We know that God created us and Christ shed all his blood for us, resides in our Tabernacles, and even allows the faithful to consume Him in the Holy Eucharist. We also know that Christ loves each of us personally and wants us to love Him in return - in fact, He made this His first commandment: *"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment".*
