

May we all remain: One in the Lord. Vivat Jesus!









We are also encouraging our KC's, especially 4th Degree Knights in full regalia, to attend this march. We have enjoyed a very visible presence over the past couple of years thanks to the many Knights, both 3rd & 4th Degree, that have at-

The Louisiana Life March will start at 1:00pm on Saturday, January 12, 2013 and will run from the "old" State Capital to the "new" State Capital. Fourth Degree Knights will meet at the Cathedral at noon and proceed as a group to the old State Capital. The Louisiana Life March is sponsored by the Louisiana Right to Life Federation, the Louisiana Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Louisiana Knights of Columbus, and several other Pro-Life groups.

The National March for Life will be held in Washington D.C. on Friday, January 25, 2013. This is two weeks after our State march, so Councils do have an opportunity to assist with both marches. Those attending the National March For Life are in need of support from our Councils. Your Council can sponsor youth in your area who want



to attend the march by providing financial or logistical assistance. Some Councils provide financial support by making a donation to a participating youth group or school. Others Councils choose to sponsor individual youth participants that have more extreme financial hardship. Others provide logistical support by helping to load & unload busses or providing for material needs such as supplying meals for the trip. The trip to D.C. is rather long, so many of the groups who travel to the national march do not stop at restaurants for meals. They instead eat "on the road" in order to save both time & money. By providing a breakfast, lunch, or dinner for a local group who attends the National March for Life, you are making a significant contribution to the group.

There is more information relating to the National March for Life including a list of local sponsors & a short video slideshow on the CD that was provided to each Grand Knight at Grand Knight's Day. The list will assist you in determining who to contact in your area. The video is suitable for viewing by your Council and will help you "sell" this activity as a potential Council project. There is also an informational flyer on the CD covering the Louisiana Life March. Please print and circulate copies of this flyer within your Council and church parish to help increase participation.

Another activity that many Councils sponsor in January is putting up white crosses in front of your local church. This display is another visible reminder of the many babies lost in our Country since the Roe v Wade court decision essentially legalized abortion on demand.

We hope that all of our Councils participate in as many of the aforemen-

tioned activities as possible this coming year, as we solemnly commemorate the 40th anniversary of Roe v Wade.

We are getting to the heights of the Catholic Youth Leadership Award Program at this time of the Columbian year. Area High School Seniors have to the end of January to complete their applications and get them back to your council. You should be ready to judge these applications and pick your winner to send to the Area Coordinator. Remember that CYLA places an emphasis on Catholic values, scholastic achievement, athletics, and leadership in the areas of church, school and community. Catholic seniors throughout the state of Louisiana are eligible to participate in the CYLA program. Each council that participates in the CYLA program will find it to be both rewarding and fulfilling. Giving outstanding Catholic seniors the opportunity to compete for cash prizes, awards, and recognition is the very foundation of the CYLA program.

Area Coordinators conduct their respective area competition and award one boy and one girl the distinction of being an area winner as well as a state finalist. The Area Coordinator then sends the nomination forms of the finalist to the state chairman. A total of 22 finalists will compete for the state championship. The state chairman appoints ten state level judges who will grade the nomination forms of the finalists and conduct the verbal competition held in April. Upon completion by the state judges, the scores are tallied by the state chairman and are used as part of the overall score of the finalist.

Every student nominee should utilize the online interactive nomination form found at the state web site. This allows for a neater and more standardized application to be produced, permitting the maximum room for content to describe the nominee's activities and accomplishments.
