



# **CULTURE OF LIFE STORIES**

#### PRO-LIFE POLITICS

Recently I attended a reception sponsored by the Louisiana Right to Life to honor our legislators that have supported pro-life values. Each elected official that came got a chance to speak about their convictions and what they considered were their accomplishments supporting the pro-life in movement here in Louisiana. One state representative spoke about the need to oppose abortion and support pro-life legislation and then began to discuss the need to advance government welfare programs like the state medicaid program if one was truly pro-life. His argument was that we needed to promote pro-life values throughout everyone's lifespan and that to really be pro-life we had to support government programs that provided support for individuals in every circumstance and not just in the beginning and the end of their lives.

After the meeting, I told him that what he had to say was obviously a very polarizing issue and that at meetings like these I thought it would be more productive to promote what pro-lifers have in common. I told him that many who disagreed with him on expanding government programs, agreed on the same end result, that is, compassionately caring for those in need but had different ways of getting there.

Those of us who have been in the "pro-life" movement since the beginning of legalized abortion have always dealt with false allegations that "prolifers" do not care about life issues once the baby is born. Pope John Paul II did more to highlight how untrue this notion is than anyone else by making the phrases "culture of life" and "culture of death" mainstream labels to a movement that has been reinvigorated by his writings and example. I believe the term "culture of life" as opposed to "pro-life" is an important distinction and paradigm shift to clarify what the Catholic pro-life movement is all about. The Catholic pro-life movement in America truly has a mission that cannot be considered anything less than all encompassing. A movement that embraces all life issues and that truly promotes a complete "culture of life" from conception to natural death. A movement that in the vast majority of this country has the Knights of Columbus as its backbone.

I certainly do not need to catalogue all of the support services provided by those that champion the culture of life to mothers that want to bring new lives into the world. Church parishes, Catholic diocesan offices, local Knights of Columbus councils and the Supreme Knights of Columbus organization provide countless resources to not only help women in need but also provide support for the homeless through programs like Habitat for Humanity, to the hungry through food banks and soup kitchens and to those in need of medical care through various charitable organizations and free clinics. All of the above is provided without government assistance or tax dollars.

Government programs are necessary to fill gaps for those in need. There is no denying that. However, to say that someone does not promote the culture of life because they do not support the ever growing expansion of government programs is wrong and that idea takes away from what we do as brother knights. If we have government programs that are so big and address every societal need, what opportunity do we have for charity?

As Knights, we are leading the charge in promoting the culture of life in a society that continually embraces more and more a culture of death. It is through our charity and sacrifice that we will overcome the culture of death. Government programs cannot provide compassion no matter how many tax payer funded dollars they have.

On the other hand, The Marguerite d'Youville Home for unwed mothers supported through Knights of Columbus fundraisers provides a place for mothers to live and a good dose of compassion. The Knights of Columbus that volunteer at the local free clinic for working uninsured persons provide compassion. The toiletries and clothes donated by local Knights councils to the diocesan home for battered women provide compassion. The witness by brother Knights in pro-life marches show that all life is sacred and we are a society that values and promotes a culture of life.

The legislator that equated the need to promote expanding welfare programs as necessarily pro-life

was well intentioned, he just has a different life experience than me and my brother knights. We have seen first-hand what a difference a small group of men can make in our community with a lot of hard work and just a little money. I know that the money I give, the work that I do and the time my council spends doing for others to promote the culture of life will go infinitely farther than a government program ever can. Every minute and every dime we spend doing charitable work promotes a culture of life though we may never know the extent of it. Let us continue to find more opportunities to promote the culture of life and to impact the lives in our communities through our labor and charity.

# **SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE SUNDAY**

Each January, "Sanctity of Human Life Month" is observed in churches throughout our country to remind Americans of the inestimable value of every innocent human life.

On Jan. 22, America will mark the tragic 43rd anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the U.S. Supreme Court's disastrous decision to legalize abortion on demand in all 50 states. Since that time, approximately 59 million unborn children have been lost to abortion, mostly because someone considered them too inconvenient or expensive. That staggering number represents somewhere between one-half to one-third of my entire generation, and the cultural consequences of this loss are incalculable.


Because many Americans - including people of faith - are still unaware of the scope of this tragedy and what can be done to address it, a growing number of churches across the nation have begun to recognize the third Sunday in January each year as the "Sanctity of Human Life Day." This tradition, which grew out of the annual proclamations of President Ronald Reagan beginning in 1984, is an opportunity to share what Scripture teaches about the inherent dignity and value of every single human life, and what responsibility we have to act in love to defend it.

As more people of faith understand this issue and help raise awareness, reach out a renewed hand of compassion, and stand unapologetically for this biblical principle, we know it can make a difference. Polls show that a growing majority of Americans now identify themselves as "pro-life," but we have a long way yet to go before human life in all of its expressions - preborn, newborn, elderly, disabled - is fully embraced and legally protected.

In light of recent media attention given to the atrocities of Planned Parenthood, there has never been a better time to explain the facts about the abortion industry - and our pro-life cause. Pastors are in a unique position, and, I believe, have a particular responsibility, to inform their congregations and influence the culture about these issues. This January will be the perfect time to do so, and a wealth of excellent materials is now available to assist in this effort.

In Moses' last days he reminded the people of God's eternal faithfulness and the promise of restoration. "This day I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses," he said. "Now choose life, so that you and your children may live." (Deut. 30:19) That same profound admonition echoes down through the generations to us today.

The time is urgent, and the people need to hear it. Let's do our part to share the message. (Visit the website and download content using this link.)

NEW ULTRASOUND INITATIVE Kelvin and Mary Langlois (Council 12906)

The Northshore's KC Councils have formed a committee to explore options to obtain matching funds for an ultrasound machine for the Gianna Center. The Gianna Center is a full service medical clinic focusing on fertility treatments in accordance with the teachings of the Catholic Church. This effort will be in addition to the ongoing support for the Women's New Life Center and Access Crisis Pregnancy Centers already provided by the Knights of Columbus. Council 12906 will act as the focal point to process the request for matching funds under Supreme's Ultrasound Initiative Program. Fundraising for this is expected to start first quarter 2016.

# ARTIFICIAL REPRODUCTIVE TECHNOLOGIES

Consider the dark side of Artificial Reproductive Technologies such as IVF & surrogate motherhood:

"The 'Infertility Industry' is a growing multi-billion dollar industry. Surrogacy and the selling of human eggs and sperm generate huge profits. One commissioned pregnancy can generate as much as \$300,000.

If we believe that human beings should not be for sale and should not be trafficked or manufactured like products, and if we believe that women deserve better than to be treated as mere baby machines, then we must oppose third-party reproduction, surrogacy in particular.

Adults are bending time and space in order to satisfy their desire for children. By signing contracts before conception they can pre-order and pre-sell human beings without breaking any laws. This loophole needs to be closed to end a marketplace in children.

The commissioned child has become an object to be bought and sold, rather than a precious begotten family member deserving of love and protection."

The Family Life Federation, located at 4724 Jamestown Avenue in Baton Rouge offers free services to women throughout their pregnancy. The services offered include: pregnancy tests. counseling, alternatives, adoption abortion information, natural family planning, nutrition and educational programs. In the last year, the Center has served over 1,000 women in crisis pregnancies in the Baton Rouge area.

This calendar year, the Knights have made donations to other organizations to include the East Feliciana Council on Aging, East Feliciana Food Pantry, West Feliciana Food Pantry, West Feliciana Council on Aging, Louisiana Vets. Fest, Special Olympics, Louisiana K.C. Mental Disability Fund, American Cancer Society, West Feliciana Project Graduation, Diocese of Baton Rouge- Office of Vocations, Women's New Life Center, United Methodist Church/Thanksgiving Program and have covered the costs a young person for the church parish to attend the National Right to Life March held in Washington D.C. each January.






Louisiana Life March South: Start at Old State Capitol Gather at 9:45 AM.


#### BOOK RECOMMENDATION





Through your commitment to life, whether by accepting the birth of other children or by welcoming and caring for those most in need of someone to be close to them, you will become promoters of a new way of looking at human life."
