Conner, Council No. 3012 and second by Bro. H. J. Albert, Council No. 714 that the Resolution Committee take care of the situation. Bro. C. S. Coco, Council 3208 then recommended that each Secretary talk to his Delegate to have this Resolution killed on the floor of the State Meeting. A motion was made by Bro. Keller, Council No. 2409 and seconded by Bro. ### MINUTES OF THE STATE FINANCIAL SECRETARIES ASSOCIATION

May 24th, 25th, 1952

The State of Louisiana Financial Secretary Association held its Annual Meeting at Poor Boy's Restaurant, Lafayette, on Sunday, May 25th, 1952 with Chairman C. T. Bienvenu, of St. Martinville, presiding and 70 members answering roll call.

The Chair opened the meeting with prayer. The roll call of officers was as follows:

The Minutes of the 1951 meeting were read and on motion of Brother Henry Hingle, of Istrouma Council No. 2807 seconded by Brother A. J. Bracquet of Kaplan Council No. 2913 and carried, they were approved as read.

Chairman C. T. Bienvenu introduced Brother James E. Fleming, Insurance Agent of the Knights of Columbus and the latter, in a few well chosen words introduced Judge John E. Swift, Supreme Knight, of New Haven, Conn.

Judge Swift, who could not remain for the rest of the business session spoke on the importance of the Financial Secretary—"than whom no more important an officer exists in the Knights of Columbus." He dwelt a while on the splendid financial condition of the Knights of Columbus worth now \$84 million dollars of which \$15,000,000 have been spent for Beneficiaries of deceased Knights since its inception 70 years ago. He said that compensation of Secretaries depended on their activities, the size and condition of their Council. He knows of one Financial Secretary who has to look after the business of a Council with 3700 mem-

bers. He urged Financial Secretaries to talk about the soundness of Insurance to all applicants and convince them they are able to pay this Insurance. "The trouble is applicants are entirely too modest about their ability to pay the installments in Insurance." The money derived from Benefit Reserve and Insurance Premiums is used as loans to Catholic Institutions, only. Even though an applicant is over 26 years and doesn't have to carry Insurance, members in general and Financial Secretaries in particular should prevail upon all applicants to take Insurance as protection for themselves and family.

His remarks were enjoyed by the Financial Secretaries and their wives who partook of the delicious barbecue dinner along with our distinguished guest, Judge Swift, Brothers Fleming and LaFleur, Insurance Agents.

Under old business, it developed that all Resolutions taken up last year were either killed or withdrawn.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Bienvenu said that he believed a Resolution should be offered to the Delegates at the Convention petitioning them to permit an Alternate to attend the Financial Secretaries meeting when the Financial Secretary could not attend. It was then moved by Brother Norris, No. 3208 of Lake Charles, seconded by Brother James P. Balser, Council No. 3411, of New Orleans, that in the event the Financial Secretary cannot attend, the Treasurer be the Alternate. After some discussion the motion was carried.

Another suggestion by the Chair that our Organization have a Representative meet with the Officers of the State Council at all their meetings, brought some discussion, and a motion made by Brother Hymel of Council No. 3246, of New Orleans, seconded by Brother Balser, of Council No. 3411 and carried, demanded this action.

### REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

After some discussion it was decided by the Resolution Committee that whereas Resolution No. 1 does not pertain to the State Council and is within the jurisdiction and authority of each Subordinate Council to make such a substitution when the Secretary cannot attend, we recommend that it would be untimely and unnecessary to send such a Resolution to the House of Delegates or the State Council.

In a re-resolution to have a Representative meet at all meetings of State Officers:

The Committee feels that this is within the authority of the State Deputy and it is suggested, instead, that the Chairman contact the State Deputy and suggest to the State Deputy that he invite the Chairman or a substitute to the State Officers meeting.
