

When the Knights of Columbus Board members met the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI at the Vatican in Rome during a private audience on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of October in the Year of our Lord Two Thousand and Eight they were privileged to enter a special guest room for outstanding dignitaries and special groups.

The Pope welcomed the Knights with outstretched hands and special blessings. He was overjoyed to see them and greeted them with beautiful words, and thoughts about his recent trip to the United States. He recalled that he was amazed to see so many 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights in their outstanding regalia. He saw the beautiful bell tower donated by the Knights at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, and was deeply touched by the beautiful paintings completing the Shrine Chapel after so many years of waiting.

The Board was able to observe the many repairs made by the Knights these past few years at the Vatican. It was during the reigns of the late Pope Paul VI and Pope John Paul II that most of this came about.

Then the Pope turned his thoughts to this year, dedicated to St. Paul. He asked the Knights to read a chapter every day from the Bible and learn what he had to say.

Finally, the Pope had a phrase ready for the Knights to reflect on because he was certain that Venerable Michael McGivney must have read and reflected on it, too. The words he selected were: "We are called to Holiness", from St. Paul to the Romans of his time.

He believes that Venerable McGivney used these words or had them in mind when he was inspired to form an order of Knights to be a fraternal association of Christian laymen and leaders to do charitable works and be in concrete solidarity with the successor of St. Peter in his ministry to the Universal Church. As a result, our Order has given to the Holy See during the reigns of Pope Paul VI, Pope John Paul II and our present Pope Benedict XVI \$44.8 million for the "Vicarious Christi Fund".

In addition, the13,485 plus Councils have given \$1.8 million for the increase of vocations. Since the start of RSVP groups in 1981, a total of \$41 million has enabled nearly 66,000 men and women to pursue their vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

The Holy Father told the Knights he heard of many, many other works of charity performed by the Knights by listening to Supreme Knight Carl Anderson on Mother Angelica's EWTN.

Our Holy Father concluded by calling the Knights dear friends, and asked them to convey to all Knights of Columbus his Apostolic Blessings and good wishes for being outstanding Catholic men and continue to remember him and the Church. He said we all received a wonderful gift when we became a Knight and that we should continue to pray the beautiful rosary at all of our Council meetings and conventions.



## The New Acompano Raffle

Each year, the first year seminarians at Notre Dame Seminary and Notre Dame Staff spend 8 days with the people of Nicaragua. This year's trip will take place from January 2 through January 10, 2009.

The Knights of Columbus hold an annual Acompano Raffle to raise funds to help pay for the seminarians' trip. Fr. Jose Lavastida, Rector of Notre Dame Seminary, says that the trip costs between \$30,000 and \$40,000. The proceeds from our raffle provide a large portion of these funds.

Ticket prices again this year will be \$5 per ticket. The winning tickets will be drawn at the State Convention on Saturday, May 2, 2009 rather than Grand Knights Day in January. This will allow more time to sell tickets and hopefully provide more money to the Seminary for the trip. Another change this year will be merchandise prizes rather than money prizes. The ten prizes (and their approximate value) are as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> prize – 7 Day All Expense Paid Carnival Cruise (\$2500)

2<sup>nd</sup> prize – 42" TV (\$1200)



of Choice Act. Before the election. Barrack Obama promised one group that passage of this bill would be his first act as President. Whether he will try to do this remains to be seen; however, we cannot wait to see if he will keep his promise. Please take a few moments of your time to visit two websites. One, to sign a petition against the Act, the other to send a message directly to President-elect Obama that you feel very strongly against this legislation. The sites are http://www.fightfoca.com and http:// /change.gov

If FOCA passes, what can we expect? (1) public funding of abortion, (2) overturning of laws protecting the rights of medical & nonmedical personnel who refuse to participate in abortions, (3) overturning of laws protecting facilities including Catholic hospitals that refuse to provide abortion services, (4) elimination of the requirement that only medical doctors (physicians) perform abortions, (5) removal of restrictions that provide for parental notification when a minor seeks an abortion, (6) removal of restrictions prohibiting a minor from crossing State lines to have an abortion without parental consent, (7) overturning of all laws by States that would ban abortions within their State if Roe v Wade is one day overturned by the Supreme Court, (8) elimination of laws protecting a baby that survives an abortion, & (9) elimination of laws banning the intact dilation and extraction procedure, commonly referred to as the "partial birth abortion".

Again, please take a few minutes to prevent passage of this bill.

3. Each senior should have their parish priest sign the form and turned over to the Council for judging.


4. The council will then pick 1 Girl and 1 Boy winner to send to their Area Coordinator by February 2nd Deadline.



He is visited by people from all over praying for his intercession.

The Blessed Seelos Shrine is also on the Church grounds.

Gasper T. Corpora District Deputy 12 is a Blesser of Blessed Seelos for Tangipahoa Parish. A man in Loranger, Louisiana was diagnosed with Squamous Cell Cancer. He was blessed with a Blessed Seelos Cross by Gasper T. Corpora. He went through six weeks of radiation and chemo and then had surgery to remove the remainder of the tumor. He is now cancer-free. His surgeon was the great Dr. Anna Pou, who has also visited the Seelos Shrine.
