



Alan Benoit, Jennings Council 2012 claimed top honors as Brother Benoit captured six matches to capture his first state nine ball championship.


B.J. Dufrene, Council 1905, Gretna, posted a 7-2 record, and laid claim to the second place.



Brothers, St. Mary's derives it's funding from government support through Medicaid, individual benefactors, corporations, and foundations. St. Mary's strives to provide a level of care that gives their residents the highest quality of life. A breakdown in funding percentage for St. Mary's are as follows; 91% is Client

Care-Louisiana Medical Assistance Program, 3% Client Care-Parents and Social Security, 3% Contributions and Grants, and 3% Other Sources. As you can plainly see it truly takes a lot funds to bring these special services to everyone in need. However each year the cost of direct care rises. Medicaid funding is inadequate to cover the costs of some programing for residents such as work training, the ABA Learning Center, and other meaningful activities. That is why St. Mary's continues to rely on our support to help provide the highest quality of life possible for all of the residents of St. Mary's. For years now Louisiana Knights of Columbus has been proud to help fund St. Mary's through our works of charity by way of MDF, and fundraisers. We as Louisiana Knights of Columbus are Blessed to be able to stand side by side with St. Mary's by supporting them to do Thy Lord's compassionate works of love for all our Brothers and Sisters who live at St. Mary's. 
